








Bask in beautiful vistas as your group canoes down the Little Miami River, one of the top ten nationally-recognized scenic rivers. For hiking, biking and boating, it doesn't get better than Caesar Creek State Park. Home to a 2,830-acre lake, forty-three miles of hiking trails, thirty-one miles of horse trails and camps and five-miles of mountain bike trails.

Shop our **"Antique Capitals of the Midwest,"** the historic communities of Waynesville and Lebanon are an antiques oasis with more than 100 boutique, antique and specialty shops. Quaint towns throughout the county offer groups a unique shopping experience with tree-lined streets and inviting store fronts bursting with country charm.

The Beach Waterpark features more than 50 rides and attractions. It's a tropical adventure right here in Ohio, complete with 35 acres of real ocean sand, palm trees, crashing waves and the sights and sounds of an oceanfront paradise.

At **Morgan's Canoe Livery** you can raft or canoe down the Little Miami River, which is recognized as one of the Top 10 Scenic Rivers in the country.

Fort Ancient is North America's largest prehistoric Native American hilltop enclosure built more than 2,000 years ago by Ohio's Hopewell culture. Home to 18,000 square feet of earthen walls, hiking trails, a museum and two scenic overlooks, it is truly a must-see destination.

Maps, documents and artifacts related to the **Underground Railroad** can be seen at the Springboro Historical Society Museum. A walking tour of the city and an extensive oral history highlight the 14 documented safe houses.

The Golden Lamb Inn & Restaurant, Ohio's oldest continually operating inn, has been visited by 12 U.S. Presidents and other famous Americans like Mark Twain and Stephen Foster.

Warren County's fall festivals attract more than 500,000 visitors each year. Don't miss the **Country Applefest**, the **Ohio Renaissance Festival**, the **Ohio Sauerkraut Festival**, or the **Historic Lebanon Horse-Drawn Carriage Christmas Parade**.
