ITINERARY

DAY 1

Columbus is the place to begin your group's tour of Ohio's Central region. Kick things off with lunch at the downtown **North Market** before touring **Krema Nut Co.**, where visitors can sample an endless variety of nut mixes and tasty treats. For your group's next tour, the neighborhood of **German Village** offers a charming atmosphere laden with 19th-century brick houses, German pubs, and eclectic shops. Be sure to stop by **The Book Loft of German Village** to shop for gifts, souvenirs, and—of course—books. Your group would be remiss to exclude a stop at the **Ohio Herb Education Center** in nearby Gahanna, named the “Herb Capital of Ohio.” End your first day in the region with a dinner at **Hofbräuhaus**, a German brewery and restaurant able to accommodate group bookings.

DAY 2

Your group's second day in the Columbus area starts with a tour of **Mott's Military Museum**, home to military artifacts from the Revolutionary War to the modern day, including vehicles, aircraft, and even a Higgins Boat from World War II. Continue your group's journey through history with a visit to **Newark Earthworks** in Heath. This historic site features earthworks, or mounds, formed by Native Americans 2,000 years ago. Follow your visit with lunch at **Earthworks Cafe** before treating your group to a treat at **Velvet Ice Cream**, which celebrated its 110th anniversary last year and takes its name from the smooth, creamy texture of its featured product. Enjoy a public art display in Dublin at the **Field of Corn** before convening for dinner at **The Morgan House**, another beloved Dublin attraction.

DAY 3

On your group's final day in the Central region of Ohio, continue to take in moving military history at the **National Veterans Memorial and Museum** in Columbus, where the stories and experiences of veterans come to life in a narrative journey. For an experience of the unique history of the region, bring your group to tour the **American Whistle Corporation**, the only surviving whistle manufacturer in the United States. Visitors learn all about the manufacturing process that goes into whistle making, from raw materials to ready for shipping. For lunch, head to Union County, where your group can picnic on one of the area's many **covered bridges**. End your group's trip with savory sips at **Dalton Union Winery & Brewery** in a peaceful countryside setting to reflect back on your trip through Central Ohio.
